

Retired Ambassador James Collins Talks Russian Relations with Residents of Riderwood

SILVER SPRING, MD-With international affairs in the Middle East taking center stage this summer, the relationship between the United States and Russia is again under the microscope.

Residents of Riderwood, the Erickson Living retirement community, were able to hear from a diplomat who has enjoyed a unique vantage point to relations between the two super powers.

The Continuing Education Committee of Riderwood hosted retired Ambassador James Collins on September 26th for a presentation entitled "U.S. Relations with Russia: Is the Past Prologue?" Over 150 residents attended the learning series event.

Ambassador Collins served as the U.S. Ambassador in Moscow during the transition from Boris Yeltsin to Vladimir Putin (1997-2000); retired from the diplomatic

corps, he is now the Director of the Russia and Eurasia Program at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace.

"Career diplomats who represent the interests of the United States in foreign embassies often go unnoticed, but their service is vital to our nation," stated Robert Sprinkle, who coordinated the event and introduced Ambassador Collins. "We are proud to have such a distinguished public servant as James Collins share his insight and knowledge."

Ambassador Collins paraphrased a predecessor, Robert Strauss, in describing the typical state of affairs between the two nations. "They are never as bad as reported but never as good as you'd like them to be," stated Ambassador Collins.

He noted that domestic politics, not international events, often dictate the relationship between the United States and Russia. Ambassador Collins also identified pivotal opportunities that could influence the future of the two counties.

"The removal of U.S. forces in Afghanistan and the Syrian chemical weapons agreement offer openings for the relationship to be increasingly effective and productive, but they also could be nothing more than just marking time," he stated.

Following his presentation, Ambassador Collins fielded questions from the audience on topics that included the socio-economic development of Russia, the impact of the Iranian nuclear program and the interplay with China.

With degrees from Harvard and Indiana University, Ambassador Collins joined the Foreign Service in 1969 - his first assignment being at the Consulate General in Izmir, Turkey.

He has received distinguished service awards from the State Department, Defense Department and NASA as well as honorary degrees from The Russian Academy of Science, Nizhniy Novgorod State Linguistics University, Moscow State University, Indiana University and the University of Maryland University College.





Rosapepe's Report to Beltsville

Upgrades to Powder Mill Rd

The Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) recently began a \$2.1 million safety and resurfacing project along Powder Mill Road between the Beltway and Pleasant Acres Drive. Weather permitting, the project should be complete late summer 2014. This project was made possible with funding from the state transportation package that was passed by the legislature earlier this year. Delegates Barbara Frush, Joseline Peña-Melnyk, Ben Barnes, and I worked hard to make sure it would bring important improvements to our community.

Currently, crews are constructing sidewalk ramps, along with new concrete curbs and gutters. This will continue through late fall. Other work to be completed in 2014 includes:

- Installing a new countdown pedestrian signal and energy efficient lights at High Point High School and at the intersection of Cherry Hill Road
- Installing 1,200 feet of guardrail
- Cleaning drainage inlets and
- Patching, grinding, and resurfacing all lanes

SHA is closing a single lane in both directions on Powder Mill Road, weekdays between 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. During the resurfacing phase of the project next year, crews will also close a single lane in both directions of Powder Mill Road, Sunday-Thursday, overnight between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m.

These improvements will enhance safety for both drivers and pedestrians including students, staff, and visitors to High Point High School.





Baker Bill STUFF 'N THINGS

I want to start off this month with a big thank you for driving with your lights on. Now, the new shows I call soaps, they can't tell a whole story in time allotted because all have added a new 5 minute commercial, every 10 minutes. My favorite show was NCIS but it is so complicated this year and the story is so cut up it's hard to keep up with. In one shot Gibbs is talking at the Navy yard the next he's in Iran being shot at with no foundation in the story. I guess I'll need to find a new show to like.

Here's a thought. Have you noticed whenever there is a commercial or show and someone is barbecuing, the cook has 5 half smokes and 4 or 5 hamburgers on the grill but only 1 or 2 persons to eat them. I notice stuff like that! I also notice that many movies do not make sense, for example, in chase scenes they have tires squealing on dirt roads.

As you know I was a Bakery owner for 40 years, a bakery master and an instructor. I also took 2 years to learn how to be a TV producer and I was certified! Now I'm just certifiable. I did the TV thing to learn how to produce my own Baker Bill tapes for resale. But you can not make a tape alone; I learned that the hard way. I also went to a company that makes tapes and found out the first prototype would cost over \$5.000 dollars.

When I started this monthly blog it was called Baker Bill's baking tips. I got to thinking about that and maybe I should do that again. If you are baking a cake and you put nuts in it many times they wind up all on the bottom. Here's a tip, coat the nuts with flour first and they will stay in place. This is because cake becomes liquid when baking. I have a great recipe for fruit cake. It's so good you won't give it away like the ones they sell in the barber shop. First purchase the pound tub of candied fruit from the supermarket. They will carry it soon if not today. Then drop me a line and I will send the recipe to you with all the side notes. Yea, it's that

good. It's so good you'll rename it because the name fruit cake has a bad rap. Call it Holiday Cake? Here's another kitchen tip, wash all non-stick pans by hand. The dish washer will remove the non stick coating in two washings.

This is the time or the year to make bread. Just go to my website, www.bakerbill.net, click on recipes scroll down to bread you'll find a few hundred there. Now when you purchase the yeast, do not keep in the fridge or freezer. If you do the moisture it will pick up will kill it so you will need to buy more. Costco sells a pound of yeast for just a couple of bucks. I know a pound will last you the rest of your life. Keep it in sealed mason jars; it will keep dry for 2 years or more. I have used yeast 5 years old. In the bakery we use mostly wet yeast but keep the dry as backup.
