UpStage Artists, Beltsville's premiere Community Theater Group is winding down it's 2022 season with Agatha Christie's And Then There Were None (auditions are August 19 and 20 and if you are interested you can find all the info at www.upstageartists.com/ audition) and looking ahead to next season. Although the dates have not been set, the shows have been chosen. Next season will see 4 new shows, a mix of comedy and drama, all classics, and a whole lot of fun. The shows they have chosen are Twelve Angry Men, The Odd Couple, A View From A Bridge, and The 39 Steps.

Twelve Angry Men is a riveting drama that take place after the closing arguments in a murder trial. Twelve members of the jury must deliberate, with a guilty verdict meaning death for the accused, an inner-city teen. As the dozen men try to reach a unanimous decision while sequestered in a room, one juror casts considerable doubt on elements of the case. Personal issues soon rise to the surface, and conflict threatens to derail the delicate process that will decide one boy's fate. This is one of the most suspenseful and best written plays of the 20th century.

The Odd Couple is Neil Simon's play about two best friends trying to live together without killing one another. This classic comedy opens as a group of the guys assemble for cards in the apartment of divorced Oscar Madison. And if the mess is any indication, it's no wonder that his wife

Student Loan Debt Relief Tax Credit – September 15th Deadline

Maryland students who have at least \$20,000 in undergraduate and/or graduate student loan debt, and have at least \$5,000 in outstanding student loan debt, can apply for the Student Loan Debt Relief Tax Credit. Visit mhec. maryland.gov to learn more and apply. Applications are due September 15th.

Renters tax credit -**October 1st Deadline**

If a renter is over age 60 and has less than \$200,000 in assets, the renter is eligible to receive a tax credit of up to \$1,000. Also, Prince George's County gives an additional credit of 50% of the state credit so the maximum credit in Prince George's is \$1500. The renters must be living in a building where the owner is paying real estate taxes (i.e., not a government

This year, the Maryland General Assembly approved legislation to extend the submission deadline for the Homeowners Property Tax Credit and Renter's Tax Credit to October 1, 2020.

Help Stop Animal Cruelty!

By the time you read this issue of the Beltsville News, Maryland's primary election will be over and campaigning for the general election will be underway. Beltsville Community Cats is a Politics-free zone! If you are looking for a respite from all the ads, calls and texts, consider becoming a volunteer with Beltsville Community Cats. Spending a little time with kitties needing your help will raise your spirits!

There's one other thing you can do to help all of America's animals. The current Congress is considering H. R. 1016, the Animal Cruelty Enforcement Act of 2021.

There are a number of Federal laws that address cruelty to animals. But those laws didn't allocate federal resources specifically to enforce those laws. As a result, federal crimes against animals often aren't prosecuted or have prosecution significantly delayed. (Local news agencies touched on this problem during their follow-up coverage on the sad story of Upper Marlboro's "runaway" zebras.)

H. R. 1016 would address this problem by establishing an Animal Cruelty Crimes Section within the Department of Justice's Envi-



ronment and Natural Resources Division. The new section would coordinate with the Department of Agriculture, the FBI, the U.S. Marshals Service, U.S. Customs and Border Protection, and other agencies to enforce Federal laws prohibiting animal cruelty and vigorously investigate and prosecute suspected offenders.

This bill has sponsors from both political parties, but it hasn't been voted out of committee yet. If it isn't passed before the 117th Congress adjourns this year, proponents will have to start all over when the 118th Congress convenes in January.

Help protect America's critters! Contact our Congressman, Steny Hoyer, and ask him to work for the passage of H. R. 1016, the Animal Cruelty Enforcement Act of 2021.

They would spend the day viewing a special art exhibition, museum hopping and lunching at all the best restaurants in town.

Carolyn was a member of Emmanuel United Methodist Church. She had many friends in Beltsville who will miss her warm and friendly presence.

Tech Sense By John Bell

Finding eBooks

This month I am on vacation as I write the column. As a result, I will be revisiting a topic I last touched on in 2019 to help find free eBooks to read while on vacation. eBooks are books that are stored as electronic files and are read using and EReader or software designed to read eBook files. EReaders include devices like Amazon's Kindle Reader or the Barnes and Noble's Nook and software like Calibre.

Project Gutenberg

One great source for free eBooks is Project Gutenberg. Gutenberg creates digital copies of books that are no longer under copyright. These books are in the public domain and may be freely copied by anyone. Project Gutenberg started in 1971 and is the oldest digital library with over 60,000 books including the known published works of Mark Twain, H.G. Wells, and Edgar Allen Poe. On average 50 new books are added each week. Many classics are included like Treasure Island and Alice in Wonderland, The 28 volumes of the Oz series, Tarzan, Sherlock Holmes, 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea, Frankenstein, Dracula, Pride and Prejudice, Peter pan, and the War of the Worlds. These books usually come in the EPUB or Kindle formats; often offering illustrated versions that can be read by many book readers. All the books are free.

Several published books that had their copyrights extended for 20 years have recently fallen out of copyright. As a result, I expect a lot of new material will be appearing in Project Gutenberg in the next few years. This year the copyrights for the Winnie the Pooh books



by A. A. Milne expired making it possible to publish these as free eBooks.

In general books published after 1927 (95 years ago) are now in the public domain and free to copy.

Project Gutenberg is found at (https://www.gutenberg.org). Gutenberg books can be downloaded directly to your Kindle by pointing the Kindle browser to (**m.gutenberg.org**). EPUB files can be downloaded to other eReaders.

The Library

eBooks can also be borrowed from our public library. The Over-Drive service allows books to be borrowed and used on both Kindle and Nook eReaders. The books can also be read on your personal computer, table, and telephone.

Our local library system provides several resources for borrowing eBooks. OverDrive is a resource that allows the borrowing of eBooks electronically. Overdrive works with the Kindle and Nook eReaders and apps with over 20,000 titles for each platform. Overdrive allows a book to be checked out for a limited period of time, just like the library. Our local library offers almost 30,000 books through OverDrive.

Shopping and Borrowing

Of course, it is always possible to purchase books through Amazon






