

all of the "community cat" (also called "stray") colonies in zip code 20705, trap them, and take them to a clinic in Laurel to be

altered and vaccinated. Then the cats will be returned to their own neighborhood to live out the rest of their nine lives. But there will be no more kittens, and in time, the community cat population will go down. Finding all the stray cats

in each colony and having them all altered will be a big job, though, and we can use your help. Among our needs:

Financial assistance in any amount. Because we are an official program of Laurel Cats, Inc., a 501(c)(3) organization, contributions made to Beltsville Community Cats are tax-deductible. Funds raised will be used to purchase traps and other equipment as well as to pay for spay/neuter

Someone to handle social media for us. This form of communication is essential in today's world, and we are seeking someone who has this skill and is willing to manage our Facebook page and/or create a website.

A secretary to take minutes at our meetings and maintain our records.

Volunteers to help with fundraising. It costs an average of \$60 to alter and vaccinate a stray cat, and if there is no one else able to cover expenses, Beltsville Community Cats needs sufficient funds to do so.

Volunteers willing to foster kittens until they are ready to be adopted into permanent homes.



County Budget Update

The county council has adopted a \$3.6 billion balanced county general fund budget for fiscal year 2020. The budget becomes effective July 1. A few highlights of the budget include the extension of Sunday hours at the Beltsville Library starting October 6. We're also excited to see additional funding for our school system to lower class sizes. The classroom environment plays a significant role in a student's learning process. Teachers sometimes manage 30-plus students at once, which may not allow an opportunity for each student to receive the attention they need. As a result, \$6.5 million was allocated to the Prince George's County Public School system to aid in reducing class



Dr. George Constantine Papavizas

Papavizas, George C.

Dr. George Constantine Papavizas passed away on June 4, 2019, at the age of 96. He was a resident of Beltsville from 1960 to 2016 and worked at the Agricultural Research Service (ARS) station in Beltsville until 1992. Dr. Papavizas was born in Krimini, Greece, and survived the Bulgarian, Italian, and German occupations of northern Greece including the burning of the family home by the German Army in 1943.

He finished the University of Thessaloniki with a Bachelor of Science degree in 1947 and was drafted into the Greek Army

where he was commissioned a 2nd lieutenant. Dr. Papavizas, decorated twice for acts of heroism, was wounded in the last major battle of the Greek Civil War in 1949 and almost died from his wounds, which required the loss of his left foot. Dr. Papavizas memorialized these experiences in an autobiography published by the American Hellenic Institute Foundation in 2002 entitled Blood and Tears-Greece 1940-1949.

After emigrating to the United States, Dr. Papavizas obtained his M.S. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Minnesota, returning to Greece in 1954 to marry Mary A. Sarikas, who passed away in 1999.

Dr. Papavizas had a successful science career at ARS eventually heading the pioneering biological control laboratory as well as editing two books, publishing over 200 papers, speaking all over the world at conferences, and being named ARS Scientist of the Year in 1988.

George retired in 1992 and started his "third" career—which was to write about the subjects he was passionate about—first his autobiography and then the Greek ethnicity of Macedonia in a book Claiming Macedonia and in many articles.

George is survived by his two sons, both of whom graduated from High Point High School, his daughters-in-law, and his five adult grandchildren.

Velasco, Lucille

Lucille Velasco passed away on Thursday, May 23, 2019, at the age of 93. Lucille is survived by her sons, Terry Velasco of Annapolis and Dean Loren of New York; daughter-in-law Bonnie Velasco; three grandchildren, Tim Velasco, Dru Sanderson, and Darren Velasco; and great grandchildren Olivia and Jax Sanderson. She was preceded in death by her husband, James Velasco, and eldest son, Jamie Velasco.

As a longtime resident of Beltsville since the 1950's, Lucille had the great pleasure of having many friends and knowing many families. The family would like to especially thank her girlfriends and neighbors, many of whom are longtime Beltsville residents, who made her life fulfilling.

Interment will be at Arlington National Cemetery on August 7, 2019, where she will join her husband, James Velasco.



eBooks and eReaders

Summer is here, and many of us will spend time on the beach or in the mountains relaxing and catching up on our reading. This month I will look at eBooks and eReaders.

Formats

Over the years, there have been many file formats designed for eBooks. Currently the most common format is Portable Document Format (PDF). This format was originally developed by Adobe to ensure a document could be printed correctly from any system. The PDF format was eventually opened up and is currently an international standard. The original standard has been updated to allow the reflow of text. Text reflow is the process of dynamically reorganizing the text on a page to fit the size and shape of the display medium making the text readable on multiple devices.

The ePUB format is the official standard of the International Digital Publishing Forum and can be used on many eReaders. ePUB is the most widely based eBook standard that is based on XML files as opposed to PDF files. ePUB provides support for

audio book overlays allowing the audio to be synchronized with the current page in the book. Most eReaders handle ePUB directly, but the Kindle can't handle compressed (zipped) ePUB files and recommends they be tested before

The Kindle Reader uses a proprietary Amazon standard based on the old and now defunct MOBI



standard. While Kindle is based on MOBI, it does not support MOBI files or files created by Mobipocket.

eReaders

eReaders are the hardware devices that can be used to read eBooks. An eReader can be a dedicated hardware device or software running on a computer, tablet, or

phone. Most eReaders use eInk displays. These black and white displays use a very small amount of power allowing eReaders to remain charged for days or weeks instead of hours. Some eReaders provide a headphone jack and



First Generation College Bound Comes to High Point HS

Joe Fisher grew up in a setting in which he knew very little about higher education.

"My life experience was in a low-income housing community, not realizing the resources I might have to access college," said Fisher

Fortunately for Fisher, an athletic scholarship allowed him to attend Catholic University, but as he progressed into graduate school and began a career in teaching, he contemplated how other students might be unaware of how to get into college and succeed.

Then Fisher did something about it.

The result is First Generation College Bound (FGCB), a non-profit organization that has supported the development, growth, and well-being of youth since 1990. FGCB has supported 733 college graduates and is currently supporting 1,026 enrolled students, including 142 who matriculated last year. FGCB identifies students whose families don't

have the advantage of a college degree and then helps them succeed getting into and graduating from college. Starting with Laurel High School, FGCB's College Success program has grown to partner with 6 area high schools.

In 2018, FGCB added Beltsville's High Point High School to its roster of partner schools, and the result is that this year 19 graduating High Point seniors will be supported by FGCB. Rising seniors from low to moderate income families, who have at least a 2.0 GPA and whose parents do not have a bachelor's degree, are eligible. FGCB works with these students throughout their senior year, coaching them on standardized test registration, college applications, and financial aid opportunities. This College Success program is followed by the College Retention program, which coaches the students throughout their college tenure.

Manoel Fangmo is one of the 2019 High Point graduates, and he will attend the University of Maryland at College Park on a full scholarship. FGCB showed Fangmo the opportunities he had for college, giving him numerous tips about getting financial aid and prompting him to meet scholarship application deadlines.

"FGCB was a support system to ensure I had the right documents and met my deadlines," said Fangmo.

Fellow High Point graduate Crystal Khoeun agrees.

"I didn't know much about how to apply to college, but they guided me step by step on applying and on making my decision," said Khoeun. This autumn, she will attend Bowie State University and plans to study criminal justice and English.

"First Generation College Board is like family to me," said Khoeun. "They connected with me, came every day, and would always come help us, be there for us. And if we weren't on our game, they made sure we're got on our game."



Dear Reader, I am back. Sorry for my unannounced absence last month. My father passed away on May 31, after battling an illness for the last two years. Most of my month of May was spent between my base in Maryland and The Netherlands, where my parents live. Death is never a nice experience. I am just thankful that dad has gone on to a better place and we continue to heal and move on.

Father's Day just passed, and I was able to reflect on the times I had been able to enjoy the presence of my Father and learn from his examples of integrity.

I write this to reinforce the statement that it is important to train up a child the right way. When the child grows older, that child will not depart from what you have taught them.

Growing up, television was not important to my parents. They cherished their radio a lot more. So, growing up with no television at home, I did not miss much, even though I wondered why we

could not be like other families that had televisions, VCRs and more. The absence of those things encouraged us to play outdoors and sometimes make up games to play. I do not own a television set in my home, so my children invariably have generated a love for reading and doing other things such as baking, cooking, and of course their piano-playing.

I say all this to point out the importance of the family unit and raising children right, by example of course.

Coming back to integrity, I remember in 1996, as an English Teacher at a Government-owned school in St. Kitts, I stood up to the then Attorney General who was trying to flout the law at a public event. I respectfully refused to let him have his way and when it started to get confrontational, I walked away. Police at the scene looked at me in disbelief. I told them I had not done anything wrong and that he should know better. Understand, St. Kitts is a

small island with a population of 40, 000 people. Doing what I had just done amounted to relative career-suicide as a public servant as I opened myself up to possible victimization. It never happened! For years, we would see each other, and he would at me and I would stare right back. After about nine years, we got back to being on speaking terms.

So, I hope this serves to encourage parents, to be good examples at all times, for it rubs off on the children in one way or another, eventually. I spend a lot of my time talking to my children about integrity, dressing right, speaking right, being respectful and also being helpful. I pray one day it manifests itself.

Next month, I will share my Hershey Park experience - I got tricked into going on a roller coaster - first time in 39 years --and my last ever. That's the Jive this month.





can play or stream music and can read the books to you. Books are downloaded to eReaders via Wi-Fi or in some case through a mobile network.

The Amazon line of Kindle readers are the most popular with many saying the current Kindle Paperwhite is the best product on the market. Kindle gives access directly to purchase eBooks from Amazon or access book through Prime or a subscription plan.

The Barnes and Noble Nook is probably the next most popular line of eReaders, but its market share is a fraction of the size of the Kindle. The Nook primarily uses the ePUB format but also supports PDF among others.

Kobo is an independent manufacturer of eBook readers. The readers primarily support ePUB and PDF formats, but a conversion program can be used to read Kindle books.

Reader Software

Software or Apps for reading eBooks is also available. Amazon makes its Kindle software available for Windows, macOS, Android, and iOS. Nook software is also available for these platforms. Calibre is an open source book reader and library manager that runs on most devices.

If your book preference is the PDF format, there are many PDF readers for every platform. I currently prefer using the Foxit Reader, but the Adobe Acrobat Reader is very popular. Most modern web browsers will also directly display PDF files.

I prefer reading my eBooks on my tablet. While my tablet needs to be recharged after 12 hours of use, I read a lot of material that is presented in color, and the tablet gives me a high-resolution color display. I have Kindle and Google Books apps on the tablet, and I have tried several others. I personally find the Kindle app to be better suited for how I read. I use it to read eBooks that are published as PDF. Amazon provides a tool that allows me to upload the books into the app, or I can use a file explorer to find the books stored on my device and read them that way.

Next Month

Next month I plan to discuss getting free and inexpensive books online. Until then, enjoy reading.




