

Veteran's Day at Konterra Model Air Park

On this Veteran's Day, Marcia Richards, and I attended the Free State Aeromodelers' Armistice Day Warbird Fly-In at the Konterra Model Air Park at 6050 Van Dusen Road in Laurel. This was a special salute to veterans, especially pilots, of all wars. Revelry was at 9:00 a.m. with the playing of the "Star Spangled Banner" and the raising of an American flag that flew over Iraq. The "Blackjacks" R.C. Club of "Wounded Warriors" from Walter Reed Medical Center signed it in gratitude to Gary Heath for all he has done for the group.

Throughout the day, there was formation flying of World War I colorful biplanes and sleek World War II planes with accompanying music of the era and machine gun sounds for mock dogfights. A "tontine" salute to Veterans was done at 11:11 a.m., the end of World War I, and continued toasting to vets of each war of the 20th and 21st centuries. It was wonderful to meet our "Wounded Warriors" under God's clear blue sky, and remember all those who gave so much that we might enjoy the freedoms we have today.

John Wang of Beltsville Is Honored

John Wang, resident of Beltsville, Maryland since 1969, has been named as this year's recipient of the E. Noel Luddy award for his life-long outstanding service to the broadcasting industry, issued by the Association of Federal Communications Consulting Engineers (AFCCE).

John Wang received his BSEE degree from the University of Maryland (in 1959), and his MSEE degree from the University of Pittsburgh (in 1968). He taught at Penn State before joining the technical research staff of the Federal Communications Commission in Washington, D. C. in 1969. His primary research interest is radiowave propagation. To date he has published more than 40 technical papers in different professional journals. His most significant contributions to the telecommunications community include the development of a sky-wave propagation model. This model, which greatly improves the efficiency of the utilization of the

low-frequency and the medium-frequency portions of the frequency spectrum, also forms the key part of a recommendation of the International Telecommunications Union (ITU Recommendation P.1147-3). Mr. Wang is a Fellow of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE).

Mr. Wang has been active in ITU since 1978. He also represented the United States to the 1980 and 1986 Radio Conferences dealing with standard broadcasting in the Americas and chaired the propagation group in 1986. Although retired from the FCC recently, he still serves as a vice chairman of ITU Study Group 3 (Radiowave propagation) and the chairman of its working party on ionospheric propagation.

His avocations include astronomy, bridge and Chinese history. He has written several papers on the subjects of sightings of sunspots in ancient China and the star of Bethlehem.

Scouts Compete in Orienteering

The 34th annual Maryland Scout Orienteering Competition took place on Saturday, October 30 at Jug Bay at Patuxent River Park in Southern Prince George's County. Orienteering consists of being able to read contour maps and use a compass to find their way around hill and forest, swamp and field, and river and valleys to locate orienteering markers. In the morning individual pairs competition, the scouts are guided along a blazed path and along the path they have to locate six orienteering markers and place a dot on their maps as to the exact location of the marker. Points are awarded based upon how close they are to the correct location of each marker. Adrian Villarroel, David Timus

place in the statewide pairs competition of 86 older boys pairs. In the afternoon troop competition all of the troops are given the same topographical map with 50 locations marked on the map. They have to divide up the troop into pairs and locate as many of the 50 orienteering markers as they can in 90 minutes. Each marker has a unique paper punch, which must be punched onto the corresponding box number and returned to the starting point within 90 minutes. Some of the markers are more than three miles from the starting point. Our troop obtained 207 points and placed 17th out of 64 participating troops. This is the 7th year where Troop 1033 has finished in the top 20. The scouts can't wait to compete again next

Property owners have various rights available to them throughout the assessment and appeals process. Below is the Property owner's Bill of Rights provided by The Maryland State Department of Assessments and Taxation.

PROPERTY OWNER'S BILL OF RIGHTS

Property owners in Maryland have the following rights:

- To know that the valuation and assessment of property is the responsibility of the Department of Assessments and Taxation.
- To have an understanding of the valuation and assessment pro-
- To have assurance that the valuation and assessment of property within classes is uniform.
- To have access to information which is the basis for the property

valuation and assessment process.

- To understand that the setting of property tax rates and the collection of property taxes is a local government function.
- To obtain an assessment notice upon reassessment that clearly explains that the determination of value is based on information contained in the Department's records, that the property owner has the right of access to the valuation records, and that the property owner has the right to appeal.
- To obtain at no charge the assessment worksheet (property record card) for their own property, a brochure explaining the assess-

District 1 Digest

By Tom Dernoga, Chair Prince George's County Council (District 1)

New Sports Park

One of my pet projects the past few years has been an expansion of Fairland Regional Park. In the Park & Planning Budget, this is referred to as the "Konterra Sports Park." The concept is to use 42 acres of land on the east side of Old Gunpowder Road, just across from the Gardens Ice House and north of the ICC right-of-way. This property is to be dedicated to Park & Planning as part of the approval of the Konterra Town Center East project. This area is large and it is centrally located in District 1 so that it is equally available to residents from Calverton, Beltsville, Laurel and South Laurel. It's also not too far of a drive from Adelphi or College Park.

In August, I had an ad hoc task force sit down with Park & Planning staff to discuss active recreation needs in the area. The task force included members from the Beltsville-Adelphi Boys & Girls Club, the Calverton Recreation Council, the College Park Boys & Girls Club and other area organizations.

Just before Thanksgiving, incoming Council member Mary Lehman and I met with the park planners from Park & Planning to see how they were progressing with designing the park based on the feedback that they received from the task force. While still a work in progress, it sounds great. The centerpiece would be a lighted multi-purpose, astro-turf field with extra seating availability. This would serve boys and girls soccer, football, lacrosse and field hockey. In addition, two other fullsize soccer fields are proposed. There are plans for one or more practice fields or small-size fields for younger soccer players. A full-

size baseball field is proposed as well as a practice or t-ball field. We intend to have a concession stand to support the organizations that use the fields. We are also discussing a trail around the new park that would connect with the trails currently in Fairland Regional Park. We are discussing designing this trail system to be used as a cross-country course for High Point and Laurel High Schools, in addition to being available to the general public.

One piece of good news is that the funding is virtually all in place. The one holdup is that Konterra has not finished transferring the land to Park & Planning ownership. To go beyond basic design to final design and construction, Park & Planning needs to acquire the property, conduct soil studies, and get a more accurate evaluation of the land. We hope that we can get all of the background work done and actual construction to commence in 2012. Unfortunately, all of these projects take time. The good news is that the funding and basic planning have progressed and we could see more action soon. While I will not be in office for the groundbreaking or ribbon cutting, I feel great about passing this project on to Mary Lehman to bring to fruition. Maybe I will get to kick out the first ball?

I write a final note to thank you for the opportunity of serving you these past nine years as the County Council member for District 1. After replacing Councilman Walter Maloney via special election in January 2002, I have served the past two terms with a great sense of privilege and responsibility. Now, my time of service will end on December 6th and I look forward to my next chapter.

I found that serving on the County Council is very challenging and demanding, but it is also very rewarding. Over the years, I have received many compliments for the work of my staff and myself. We have tried to be available and responsive, and while we have not always been perfect, it has been wonderful to get so many expressions of appreciation over the years

2010 has been a different year compared to the previous eight. Election years tend to be different and being Chair of Council in an election year is always a challenge in trying to keep the Council focused. Generally, we succeeded in working on the budget (kind of boring, but very necessary in troubling financial times), finally addressing the disputes over the taxi industry, adopting a collection of bills to implement the "Green Infrastructure Plan," and regulations on pawnshops, drinking in public, registering vacant homes, auto auctions, agritourism and much more.

Locally, we finally saw the Senior Center going up next to the hospital and the Auditorium for Laurel High School opened; we got the Montgomery Road improvements back into the budget and we appear to have determined a location for the new Laurel Library (basically, the existing site between 7th and 8th Streets).

Over the past six weeks, I have been working with the successor that you have chosen, Mary Lehman, so that she can hit the ground running. I have known Mary for over 15 years and she worked in the District 1 office for almost 5 years, so I have no doubt that she will do a fantastic job. As always, thank you for the opportunity to serve you. I will always treasure the friendships, the challenges and the experiences.


